ABSTRACT:

Traffic diversions are often needed at construction sites. It is well-worth remembering that diversions, however well-done, cause inconvenience to road users. While it is understandable that the project itself would be the focus of the project personnel, it is incumbent on the site engineers to minimise inconvenience and risks. There is often a misconception that potential project-related problems could be covered by third-party public liability insurance.

TOPICS TO BE DISCUSSED:

- Importance of good engineering practices and exercising due diligence
- Beyond relying on insurance as the first recourse and merely following technical guidelines from Agencies such as Land Transport Authority (LTA).
- Common things to look out for during traffic diversions to enhance safety.
- What is covered by third-party liability insurance.
