About the speaker, Mr Kelvin Kek



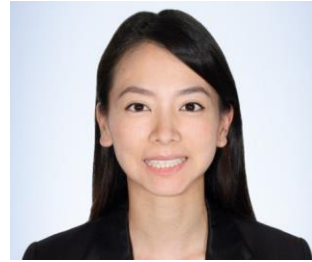
Kelvin's areas of practice encompass various aspects of commercial disputes, both in litigation and international arbitration. He has acted as counsel in a broad range of matters for multinational corporations, financial

institutions, private and publicly-listed entities. These matters include JV related disputes, directors' duties, shareholder disputes and various property related issues. The cross-border nature of his work often necessitates travel to other jurisdictions like Malaysia, Indonesia and India.

Notably, Kelvin acts for several publicly-listed developers and owners in various disputes over the construction and design of commercial and private developments in Singapore. He has also advised a number of Singaporean statutory boards on a variety of construction claims against contractors and sub-contractors, including claims relating to the Building and Construction Industry Security of Payment Act (Cap 30B). As part of his construction practice, Kelvin frequently acts for companies in arbitrations over large scale infrastructural and engineering disputes. These disputes are often cross border in nature and deal with complex issues of delay, acceleration and defect rectification.

Kelvin graduated from the National University of Singapore with an LLB (First Class Honours) degree in 2008. He was called to the Singapore Bar in 2009 and the New York State Bar in 2012. Prior to pursuing his legal career, Kelvin graduated from the National University of Singapore with a first degree in Electrical & Electronic Engineering. Kelvin is also an accredited mediator with the Singapore Mediation Centre.

Yanyi is a Senior Associate in the Litigation & Dispute Resolution Department of Allen & Gledhill, Singapore, joining them in 2011.

The Workplace Safety and Health Act (WSHA) is an important part of Singapore's regulatory framework to cultivate good safety habits in all individuals, so as to create a strong safety culture in workplaces. The WSHA requires all stakeholders to take reasonably practicable measures to ensure the safety and health of persons at the workplace.

Learning Objectives:

- Singapore's WSH 2028 Vision and the recent trends in the market.
- the different stakeholders' legal obligations under the WSHA.
- the sentencing framework for breaches under the WSHA, and
- how to handle a workplace accident, from commencing investigations to defending any prosecution.

The learning outcomes are for participants to be generally aware of the landscape and pertinent issues, as well as to gain practical tips on handling workplace incidents.

The seminar will take a practical approach towards the above issues, with the inclusion of relevant case studies in the construction sector. Time will be provided for Q&A from the attendees.
