

Safe Management Measures for Transition Towards Covid Resilience

From 10 August 2021

Social gatherings



- Group sizes of up to **5** persons
- Unvaccinated individuals should remain in groups of up to **2** persons
- Up to **5** unique household visitors¹ per day
- **2** social gatherings per day

Food & Beverage establishments (excluding hawker centres and coffeeshops)



- Dine-in allowed with group sizes of up to **5** persons if all vaccinated; provision for children 12 years and below applies²
- Dine-in is not allowed if an individual is unvaccinated
- Prohibition of recorded music in F&B establishments

Workplace



- Work-from-home remains as the default
- No cross-deployment of staff
- **From 19 Aug:** Up to 50% of employees who are able to work from home will be allowed to return to the workplace

Hawker centres and coffeeshops



- Dine-in allowed with group sizes of up to **2** persons regardless of vaccination status

Shopping malls and showrooms



- **From 19 Aug:** Occupancy limit to increase from one person per 16 sqm Gross Floor Area to one person per 10 sqm of Gross Floor Area

Marriage solemnisations



- **From 10 Aug:** Up to **500** persons if all vaccinated; up to **50** persons if unvaccinated
- **From 19 Aug:** Up to **1,000** persons if all vaccinated; up to 50 persons if unvaccinated

MICE events



- **From 10 Aug:** Up to **500** persons if all vaccinated; up to **50** persons if unvaccinated
- **From 19 Aug:** Up to **1,000** persons if all vaccinated; up to **50** persons if unvaccinated

Spectator and participatory sports events



- **From 10 Aug:** Up to **500** persons if all vaccinated; up to **50** persons if unvaccinated
- **From 19 Aug:** Up to **1,000** persons if all vaccinated; up to **50** persons if unvaccinated

Attractions and cruises



- **From 19 Aug:** Operating capacity to increase from 25% to **50%**

Hotels



- Group of up to **5** persons per room for staycations (except where individuals are all from the same household, subject to the room's maximum capacity)

Sports/exercise activities and classes provided by gyms and fitness studios



- Indoor mask-on and all outdoor activities can continue in groups of up to **5** persons, in classes of up to **50** persons including the instructor, regardless of vaccination or test status
- Indoor mask-off high intensity activities can continue in groups of up to **5** persons, in classes of up to **30** persons if all individuals are fully vaccinated

Tour groups



- **From 19 Aug:** Up to **50** persons for conveyance tours; non-conveyance tours to remain at **20** persons

Removal of temperature screening requirement



- **From 19 Aug:** Requirements for temperature screening in public premises will be removed, together with the other relaxation of measures

Those eligible for the vaccination-differentiated SMMs include:



Individuals who have received the full regimen of the Pfizer-BioNTech/ Comirnaty, Moderna or any vaccines recognised in the World Health Organisation's Emergency Use Listing, with an additional 2 weeks for it to be fully effective



Individuals who have recovered from COVID-19



Unvaccinated individuals with a valid negative Pre-Event Test (PET) result taken in the past 24 hours, before the expected end of the event

¹Does not apply for grandchildren being cared for by grandparents.

²The provision for children 12 years and below (i.e. born in and after 2009) will only be applicable to higher-risk mask off activities and large-scale events, e.g. F&B dine-in, gyms. If there is more than one child in the group, all children must be from the same household.

Annex B

Criteria to Opt out of Serving Stay Home Notice (SHN) in Dedicated SHN Facilities

From **20 August 2021, 2359 hrs**, all fully vaccinated travellers¹ from **Australia, Austria, Canada, Germany, Italy, Norway, the Republic of Korea (ROK), and Switzerland** may apply to opt out of dedicated SHN facilities and serve their 14-day SHN at their respective places of residence (e.g. residential address) or other suitable accommodation. Applications will be considered if the vaccinated traveller has fulfilled the following criteria:

- a. Remained in the above-mentioned countries², in the last consecutive 21 days prior to arriving in Singapore; and
- b. Are occupying their respective places of residence or other suitable accommodation alone, or only with household members who are also vaccinated persons serving SHN with the same travel history and duration of SHN.

2. For Singapore Citizens (SCs) and Permanent Residents (PRs), the application must be made three days prior to arrival via the [SafeTravel website](#). Travellers who are not SCs or PRs may apply to opt out as part of the entry application process from **20 August 2021, 2359 hrs** onwards. All travellers must present the approval to opt out upon arrival in Singapore. All travellers who successfully opt out must remain in their declared place of residence/accommodation at all times and are required to don an electronic monitoring device throughout their SHN period. Action will be taken against those who breach the requirements of the SHN or make false declarations. Travellers will also be required to utilise specially designated transport services to and from their place of residence and bear the costs³ for these transport arrangements.

¹ An individual is considered fully-vaccinated two weeks after he or she has received the full regimen of Pfizer-BioNTech/ Comirnaty, Moderna or WHO EUL vaccines.

² Including the following countries/regions: Brunei Darussalam, Hong Kong, Macao, Mainland China, New Zealand and Taiwan (correct as of 6 August 2021).

³ Transport is estimated to cost about \$200-220 in total for travel from checkpoint to place of residence and roundtrip for COVID-19 test before end of SHN.

Resuming Entry Approvals for Vaccinated Work Pass Holders and their Dependants

From 10 August 2021



- Work pass holders and their dependants with travel history to higher risk countries/regions¹ can start applying for entry approval, on the condition that they must be fully vaccinated² before arrival in Singapore³
- This will **not apply** to migrant domestic workers, S Pass and work permit holders from the Construction, Marine Shipyard and Process sectors. MOM will only accept new entry applications for these work pass holders from higher risk countries/regions at a later date



Those medically ineligible for vaccination should appeal to be exempted from the vaccination condition for entry, supported by a doctor's memo, before applying.



Before boarding and at checkpoint upon arrival in Singapore

- Documentary proof of full vaccination status must be shown to the airlines, or entry and boarding will be denied
- All individuals will be subjected to the prevailing health protocols in Singapore



Within two weeks from completion of their Stay-Home Notice (SHN) in Singapore

- Individuals who have received their vaccinations overseas must update their vaccination records in the National Immunisation Registry (NIR)
- Documentary proof of overseas vaccination and a positive serology test result taken at one of the Ministry of Health's designated private healthcare providers must be shown

Option for 14-day SHN at Suitable Place of Residence / Accommodation of Choice



From **20 August 2021, 2359hrs**, all travellers from **Australia, Austria, Canada, Germany, Italy, Norway, the Republic of Korea, and Switzerland** who are fully vaccinated with vaccines approved for use under Singapore's National Vaccination Programme or the World Health Organisation's Emergency Use Listing may apply to opt out of dedicated SHN facilities



14-day SHN can be served at respective places of residence (e.g. residential address) or other suitable accommodation



Travellers who successfully opt out must remain in their declared place of residence/accommodation at all times, and are required to don an electronic monitoring device throughout their SHN period. Enforcement action will be taken against those who breach the SHN requirements.



Travellers must fulfil these criteria:

- Remained in the above countries⁴, in the last consecutive 21 days prior to arriving in Singapore; and
- Are occupying their respective places of residence or other suitable accommodation alone, or only with household members who are also vaccinated persons serving SHN with the same travel history and duration of SHN



Travellers will also be required to utilise specially designated transport services to and from their place of residence, and bear the costs for these transport arrangements



All other travellers from the above countries/regions who do not fulfil the criteria must continue to serve the SHN in a dedicated SHN facility

¹ This refers to all countries/regions except Brunei, Hong Kong, Mainland China (including Jiangsu Province), Macao, New Zealand and Taiwan. The vaccination condition for entry will not apply to work pass holders and their dependants who remained in these lower risk countries/ regions within the last 21 days prior to arriving in Singapore.

² An individual is considered fully-vaccinated two weeks after he or she has received the full regimen of Pfizer-BioNTech/ Comirnaty, Moderna or WHO EUL vaccines. Please refer to MOH's website for the latest definition.

³ As announced by the Ministry of Health earlier, all long term pass holders including work pass holders and their dependants are not allowed entry into Singapore if they have recent travel history (including transit) within the last 21 days to India, Bangladesh, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Myanmar. Entry approvals for those from Indonesia are also limited.

⁴ Including the following countries/regions: Brunei Darussalam, Hong Kong, Macao, Mainland China, New Zealand and Taiwan (correct as of 6 August 2021).
