Over 120 participants turned up for the physical event.

WHY THE CRITICAL PATHS MATTERS IN TERM OF TIME AND MONEY



On May 26th, The Association of Women in Construction (Singapore) (AWiCS) organised a Online Series via Zoom Platform on "Why the Critical Paths Matters in terms of Time and Money" presented by Ms Sharon McGahey, Managing Director of Kroll Advisory Singapore Pte Ltd, which focused on the importance of critical path and careful planning in the Construction Industry.

The Online series was open to the public and approximately 60 people were in attendance. 

OUR CORPORATE COLOUR


