TOPIC

The NEC conditions of contract and how they can contribute to collaborative contracting in Singapore.

SYNOPSIS

The NEC is a family of contracts document for various types of procurement of projects and services. They are rightly being considered for use in Singapore. The course will focus on the NEC Engineering and Construction Contract (ECC). It will include:

- ❖ An overview and summary of NEC and why it is so different from traditional forms.
- ❖ A high-level comparison of NEC and FIDIC contracts.
- ❖ An overview of the parts of the contract and the process of putting an ECC tender document together.
- ❖ An introduction to the key elements of ECC contract management including:
 - early warning
 - programme
 - compensation events
- ❖ A discussion on what need to happen for NEC to work in Singapore.

OBJECTIVES

At the end of the session participants should:

- ❖ Understand the principles of NEC
- ❖ Be able to advise a client on contract strategy and the use of the various options in the ECC
- ❖ Understand the work involved in preparing an ECC tender document
- ❖ Understand in principle what will be involved in ECC contract management.
