OVERVIEW OF DIALOGUE

Avoiding Construction Conflicts and Settling Construction Disputes through Mediation can be an effective way without the need for lengthy and costly litigation or arbitration, by fostering a collaborative approach and enabling the parties to find practical solutions tailored to their specific needs. The <u>Singapore Convention</u> on Mediation (especially with regard to enforcement in other jurisdictions) is to international mediated Settlement Agreement, much like what the <u>New York Convention</u> is to international arbitration

This afternoon's dialogue with international construction industry legal practitioners from across Asia (Brunei, Pakistan and Singapore) together with Mediation Institutional experts will consider some of Mediation's range of benefits – including what it means in different jurisdictions, how it may be a far better approach to avoiding complex construction conflicts and resolving disputes, cost effective, time-efficient, and confidential, that help preserve professional relationships and allowing for flexible, interest-based solutions, the Institutional approach/support to the process, and the less adversarial nature of the process further enhancing Mediation's appeal with construction disputes.


