Lech Wałęsa is a Polish labour leader and statesman, best known for co-founding and leading Solidarity, the first independent trade union in communist Poland. His leadership played a central role in Poland's peaceful political transformation, for which he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1983. From 1990 to 1995, he served as Poland's first popularly elected president, overseeing the country's transition to a democratic system and a market-based economy, including profound reforms to its industrial and economic structures.

About the Global Leadership Forum (GLF)

In an era defined by rapid technological change, shifting societal expectations, and complex global challenges, infrastructure leaders face unprecedented pressure to deliver smarter, more resilient, and more sustainable systems.

Designed for those responsible for the planning, delivery and stewardship of critical infrastructure systems, the summit provides a forum to explore how organisations can adapt, innovate, and thrive amid accelerating change.

Participants include CEOs and C-suite executives from across the infrastructure value chain, spanning government, finance, consulting engineering, construction, professional services, supply chains, materials and products manufacturing, asset ownership, academia and industry associations. Senior
