Strengthening Resilience



Budget 2026 lays the groundwork for how Singapore will navigate its next phase of development. With persistent geopolitical tensions, supply chain vulnerabilities and slowing growth across major economies, the Budget adopts a forward-looking approach aimed at strengthening economic resilience, enhancing competitiveness, and positioning Singapore to seize emerging opportunities.

This year's measures focus on reinforcing resilience at both the national and household levels, while investing in future growth engines. A key highlight is the strong emphasis on artificial intelligence (AI), with dedicated missions to drive AI-led transformation across priority sectors. On sustainability, the Budget reaffirms Singapore's commitment to net zero, recognising that progress will depend on technological innovation and sustained international cooperation. Despite uneven global

momentum, Singapore will continue advancing its climate agenda through carbon tax and other measures to manage climate risks and support a low-carbon transition.
